


I am directed to forward herewith a copy

Subject: Verification of character and antecedents for appointment  
under the Government of India - Procedure regarding.

Sir,

I am directed to say that it has been reported to Government that a great increase has occurred in recent years in the work relating to verification of character and antecedents of candidates for appointment to Government service. For reducing the volume of work falling on the Criminal Investigation Departments of the State Governments it has been suggested that in the case of candidates for appointment to Class IV posts, where detailed verification may be prescribed, reference to the C.I.Ds. of State Governments need not be made except when an adverse report is made by the local police. Considering that a candidate for a Class IV post, who does not figure in the records of local police, is unlikely to figure in the records of the Criminal Investigation Department, it has been decided that only those cases should be referred to the C.I.Ds. where either the candidate for such appointment figures in the records of local Police, or the district authority otherwise considers it particularly necessary to do so. It is requested that instructions necessary for giving effect to this decision may kindly be issued to the District authorities in your State. A copy of the instructions issued may also please be endorsed to the Government of India.
