Sub:- Clarification regarding adhoc appointment to
different posts under Regulation 3(b)(i) of
the O.P.S.C. (Limitation of Functions)
Regulations.

Sir,

A point was made out in the meeting of the Secretaries and Heads of Departments held on 18th August, 1979 as to whether it would be permissible to make adhoc appointments for different posts in the light of the revised procedure for D.P.C./Selection Board which envisages association of a Member of the P.S.C. as its Chairman.

2. Regulation 3(b)(i) of the Orissa Public Service Commission (Limitation of Functions) Regulations stipulate that consultation with the P.S.C. as required under clause 3 of Article 320 of the Constitution will not be required in respect of temporary appointments or promotions or transfers from the service to another for a period not exceeding one year which is necessary to be made urgently. This provision has no connection with the reconstitution of D.P.C./Selection Board associating a Member of the P.S.C. or Chairman, P.S.C. as its Chairman.

3. I am, therefore, directed to clarify that the decision of the Government to reconstitute the D.P.C./Selection Board with the association of a Member or Chairman of P.S.C. does not take away the authority of the Government to make adhoc appointments in exigencies of public service for a period not exceeding one year as provided in Regulation 3(b)(i) of O.P.S.C. (Limitation of Functions) Regulations referred to above. But every endeavour should be made to have such appointments, unless extreme urgent, processed through D.P.C. with a Member of O.P.S.C. as Chairman so as to obviate making references and cross references to O.P.S.C. and dislocation of adhoc arrangements on receipt of final recommendation of O.P.S.C.
