Bhubaneswar, dated the 31st January, 1966.

Sub: Recognition of de facto reversal of final options exercised by Central Government servants - Grant of concessions.
.....

The State Government have been considering as to what retirement benefits can be allowed to the employees of the un-divided Government of India who had finally opted for service in Pakistan, but who, in the conditions that developed immediately after the Partition continued to serve in India or migrated to India or having gone to Pakistan came back to India and joined service under the State Government on or before the 31st December, 1951. After careful consideration they have been pleased to decide that services rendered prior to partition will be treated as qualifying for pension, if the service was other-wise qualifying. Similarly past partition service actually rendered in Pakistan and / or in India will qualify for pension. The period during which no duty was performed either in India or in Pakistan will not constitute a break for the purpose of determining the total length of qualifying service, i.e. the service will be treated as continuous, but the period of break it-self will not count for pension.

This has been issued after obtaining the concurrence of the Finance Department.
