Sub: Disposal of disciplinary proceedings.

Sir,

I am directed to invite reference to Para-1 of the proceedings of the meeting of Secretaries & Special Secretaries held on 2.8.88 communicated in P & C Department Memo No. 12925, dt. 6.8.88. Decisions taken in the meeting regarding disposal of pending disciplinary proceedings may be summarised as follows:

- i) Cases pending for more than ten years not involving defalcation/misappropriation of public money, serious misconduct and not pending in the court of law may be dropped after review.
- ii) Similar cases pending for more than 3 years may be finalised with minor punishments like warning, censure etc.
- iii) Cases may be transferred to the Commissioner for Departmental Inquiries for disposal.

2. It is hoped that some progress might have been made in the meantime to complete the review. The result of review would indicate precisely the actual number of cases that remain for disposal. The largest number of these cases may be transferred to the Commissioner for Departmental Inquiries for expeditious disposal. Meanwhile there are two Commissioners of Departmental Inquiries functioning in the G.A. Deptt. As many cases as possible may immediately be transferred to the C.D.I.

3. It is also contemplated that cases involving moral turpitude mis-appropriation etc. i.e. cases of comparatively serious nature may be transferred to the Disciplinary Proceedings Tribunal for disposal after taking concurrence of the General Administration Department in each individual case. Such cases may also be sorted out and the number reported to this Department for entrusting the enquiry to the D.P.T. This may also be expedited.

4. Action on all the points may kindly be completed within a fortnight and report sent to this Deptt.
