NOTIFICATION

The 5th November 1996

No. 28615—2R/1-44/96-Gen.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Orissa is pleased to make the following rules further to amend the Orissa Civil Services (Combined Competitive Recruitment Examination) Rules, 1991, namely:—

1. (1) These rules may be called the Orissa Civil Services (Combined Competitive Recruitment Examination) (Second Amendment) Rule, 1996.

(2) They shall be deemed to have come into force, with effect from the first day of January 1994.

2. In the Orissa Civil Services (Combined Competitive Recruitment Examination) Rules, 1991 (hereinafter referred to as the said rules), in sub-rule (1) of rule 4 after the words and comma "belonging to the categories of Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes," the words and comma "Socially and Educationally Backward Classes," shall be inserted.

3. In the said rules, in sub-rule (2) of rule 5 after sub-clause (b) of clause (i), the following sub-clause shall be inserted, namely:—

"(b-1). The upper age-limit in case of candidates belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes shall be relaxed by three years."

4. In the said rules, for rule 12 the following rule shall be substituted, namely:—

"12 (1). The eligible candidates shall be required to appear in a preliminary test which shall consist of two papers, i. e., one in Indian Language (either Oriya or Hindi) and another in English. The candidates qualifying the preliminary test shall be called to appear in the written test on the subjects as prescribed in Schedule-III.

(2) The candidates, who secure such minimum qualifying marks in the written test, as may be fixed by the Commission, shall be called to appear at the interview for a personality test :

Provided that the number of such candidates to be called for the personality test, belonging to each category, shall not exceed twice the total number of vacancies likely to be filled up in different services.

5. In the said rules, in rule 14 in sub-rule (3), the proviso to Note (1) shall be deleted.

6. In the said rules, in Schedule-I, serial number 10 and the entries against it under columns (2) and (3) shall be omitted.

7. In the said rules in Schedule-II, the following—

In for clause 1, the following clause shall be substituted, namely:—

“1. The Competitive Examination shall comprise as follows, namely:—

- (i) Preliminary Test
- (ii) Written Test
- (iii) Personality Test or interview.”;

(i) for clause 2, the following clause shall be substituted, namely:—

“2. Candidates who will qualify in the preliminary test, shall be called, by the Commission, to appear in the written test. The qualifying marks in the preliminary test shall be such as may be fixed by the Commission. The written test shall comprise of six papers each carrying 300 marks in the subjects prescribed in Schedule III. The marks obtained in the preliminary test shall not be counted for ranking.”; and

(iii) in clause 3:

(a) the words and comma “However, the papers on Indian Languages and English shall be of qualifying nature. The marks obtained in these papers shall not be counted for ranking. The number of candidates to be called for the personality test shall not be more than twice the number of vacancies to be filled up in that year in respect of general category and three times for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe Candidate”, shall be deleted;

(b) for the figures “250” the figures “200” shall be substituted.

8. In the said rules, in Schedule III, for clause ‘1’ the following clauses shall be substituted, namely:—

“1. The preliminary test shall consist of the following subjects:—

(1)	(2)	(3)
Paper-I	One of the Indian Languages to be selected by the candidates from (i) Oriya (ii) Hindi.	300 Marks
Paper-II	English	300 Marks

NOTE—The preliminary test shall be of matriculation standard. The test shall be of qualifying nature and marks obtained in these papers shall not be counted for ranking.

1-A. The written test shall consist of the following subjects:—

Paper-II	General Studies II	300 Marks

Total marks in written test .. 1,800 Marks

1 (B) Personality test .. 200 Marks

Total marks in written and personality test .. 2,000 Marks.

9. In the said rules, in Schedule V, serial number 10 and the entries against it under columns (2) and (3) shall be omitted.
