No. 16300-Gen.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Orissa is pleased to make the following rules regularising the appointments of persons to the posts of Lower Division Assistants in the Departments of the Secretariat and their conditions of service, namely :—

THE ORISSA MINISTERIAL SERVICE (REGULARISATION OF RECRUITMENT AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE OF IRREGULAR RECRUITS IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF THE SECRETARIAT) RULES, 1964

1. (i) These rules may be called the Orissa Ministerial Service (Regularisation of Recruitment and Conditions of Service of Irregular Recruits in the Departments of the Secretariat) Rules, 1964.

(2) They shall come into force at once.

Definitions:

2. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a) "Assistant" means a Lower Division Assistant in any of the Departments of the Secretariat;

(b) "Irregular Recruit" means any person appointed as a Lower Division Assistant in any of the Departments of the Secretariat during the period between the 12th December 1951 and the 30th June 1954, in contravention of rule 3 or rule 11 of the Recruitment Rules and includes a person, who having been appointed in accordance with rule 11 as aforesaid has been continued in service in contravention of the said rule;

(c) "Recruitment Rules" means the Orissa Ministerial Service (Method of Recruitment and Conditions of Service of Lower Division Assistants in the Offices of Departments of Secretariat) Rules, 1951;

(d) all other words and expressions used in these rules and not defined shall have the same meaning respectively assigned to them in the Recruitment Rules.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Recruitment Rules but subject to other provisions of these rules, an Irregular Recruit shall be deemed to have been validly and regularly recruited and appointed as an Assistant.

4. The seniority of Irregular Recruits in a Department of the Secretariat shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of rule 5.

5. (1) The position of Irregular Recruits in the gradation list of assistants in a Department of the Secretariat shall be immediately below the Lower Division Assistants recruited under the Recruitment Rules to that Department during the year during which the date of allotment falls, as determined in accordance with the principles specified in the following sub rules.

(2) The date of allotment under sub-rule (1) shall be such that the period between the said date and the 30th June 1964, corresponds to the percentage, determined in accordance with sub-rule (3) of the total period of continuous service of an Irregular Recruit commencing from the date of his first appointment in the Secretariat till the 30th June 1964.

(3) The percentage referred to in sub-rule (2) shall be as specified in the entry in column (2) of the Table

Qualifications on the date of first appointment in the Secretariat as an irregular recruit

(i) Having passed at least the Intermediate Examination in Arts/Science/Commerce or its equivalent and having passed the Competitive Examination held by the Commission during the year 1964 or at any time prior thereto in accordance with the provisions of the Recruitment Rules.	100 % (hundred)
(ii) With previous experience and having passed at least the Intermediate Examination in Arts/Science/Commerce or its equivalent.	50 % (fifty)
(iii) Without any previous experience but having the educational qualification as in item (ii).	33 1/3 % (thirty-three and one third)
(iv) With at least three years previous experience and having passed the Matriculation Examination or its equivalent.	33 1/3 % (thirty-three and one third)
(v) With experience for at least four years as Typist/Diarist/Recorder/Assistant Recorder in any Department of the Secretariat and having passed the Matriculation Examination or its equivalent.	25 % (twenty-five)
(vi) With previous experience for less than three years but more than six months and having passed the Matriculation Examination or its equivalent.	20 % (twenty)
(vii) With previous experience for six months or less and having passed the Matriculation Examination or its equivalent.	10 % (ten)
(viii) With the educational qualification and experience for less than four years but more than six months as specified in item (v).	20 % (twenty)

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*Explanation*—The expression “previous experience” for the purposes of this Table shall be construed as having reference to previous experience as a Lower Division Assistant or a Lower Division Clerk in any office of the Head of a Department or subordinate thereto or of a University or a Local Authority.

6. Save as otherwise provided in these rules, the provisions of these rules shall have effect notwithstanding anything inconsistent therewith contained in the Recruitment Rules or any other rules or instructions for the time being in force and applicable to the ministerial staff of the Departments of the Secretariat.

7. If any question arises relating to interpretation of these rules, it shall be referred to the State Government whose decision thereon shall be final.
