Filling up the posts of Jr. Clerks in the Collectorate.

Sir,

I am directed to invite a reference to Your D.O.

Letter No.1233 dtd.24.4.90 on the subject noted above and to state that according to Rule-7(d) of the D.M.S.(Method of Recruitment to the posts of Junior Clerks in the District Offices) Rules, 1985, a candidate in order to be eligible for appointment shall not be less than eighteen years and more than twenty eight years of age on the 1st day of April of the year in which recruitment is made. In the instant case, the recruitment is going to be made against the vacancies of 1987, 1988 and 1989 from out of the select list of 1986. As such, the maximum age limit in all these cases should be 28 years on the 1st April of the year to which the vacancies relate.


2. The maximum age limit for entry into Government service has been raised to 30 years in the Orissa Civil Service (Fixation of upper age limit) Rules, 1989 which was published in Orissa Gazette dated 27th October, 1989. This will not be applicable to the candidates who are appointed against vacancies occurring before 27th October 1989 .


